#1 Start with February's Idea:

Perspective: A point of view

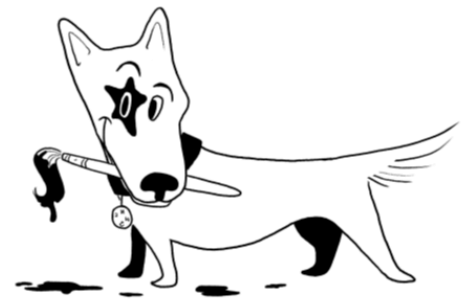
#2 Add the Creative Challenge:

Use Pointillism* to create a piece of art that shows us something from your point of view.

Up close it's just a bunch of dots, but as you move further away from it, your perspective changes and it turns into something beautiful!

*Pointillism is an art form that uses small dots of color to create an image that becomes more clear when viewed from a distance. One easy way to create art using pointillism is by using a Q-tip and paint. Younger kids can also use multi-colored round stickers to create their art.

For older students: Create a painting showing one "view" of something that can be looked at from different points of view. For example, YOUR backyard looks different from your house vs. how it looks from your neighbor's house. YOUR classroom looks different from your teacher's point of view vs. your view sitting in a desk. YOU look different from behind vs. from the front, or YOU also look different to different friends/family in your life. Have fun thinking of creating art from a different point of view!
